## About the exhibition

L'entre-silences is a meeting of seven artists each actively mapping a new or ongoing relationship through their chosen mediums, each with its own intricacies. The use of intuition as a sustained process links them further as well as highlighting a common need for reciprocity – one based primarily on acts of listening, being present, fluid responsiveness and taking on the role of witness for others, ensuring that they are seen. A process of give and take activated through proximity and an openness to breathe within vulnerable moments of silence. A symmetry reflected back onto one another and into the world. As one is able to be alongside one another in a relationship, a deepening of time can be felt. Sometimes halting entirely, trapped within a curved line, a loop with no end or beginning whereas sometimes it is seamlessly expansive, transforming into a landscape where layers of conversations overlap forming rhythms organically.

Faced with the immensity of a moment that words cannot fully contain, only briefly and partially translate; the artists form their own languages, as tools permitting documentation and understanding but also allowing for what needs to be unwritten, or remain outside comprehension.

### **Public presentations**

In juxtaposition to the exhibition, two musical improvisations will be presented, one during the vernissage and the other at the finissage. These two musical events are meant to create a space for the musicians to respond to the works included in the exhibition as well as respond to one another; adding felt layers to the scope of the work presented. These two public presentations are initiated by Irene Feher with the contribution of three students from Concordia's Department of Music: Shae Anderson, Chloé Saingier and Kate Markle.

It becomes a play of collaboration, intuition and learning. Where each participant experiments with taking and giving space, simultaneously leading and being led. While the first presentation will put them in a position of unknown, both to the works and each other; the second presentation will embody an echo of that first encounter with added knowledge guiding them through.

The approximation duration is set to last around 30 minutes.
