## **Course Delivery Modes**

We recognize that you may be teaching in different modes according to your departmental 'return to campus' plans. Whether you are continuing to teach remotely, planning to teach in a <u>blended</u> <u>or hybrid mode</u> or experimenting with a <u>bimodal</u> approach, we can provide pedagogical support.

## **Digital Course Resources**

Many faculty who recorded lectures for remote teaching are keen to continue using them when they return to campus. If you want to build a digital repository of your course lectures or polish your existing recordings, technical assistance is available to meet your needs.

A growing body of research shows that students appreciate having access to lecture recordings and use them to improve their learning in various ways:

- To prepare for tests and exams
- To review difficult material and review material they missed during the live lecture
- To improve the detail and clarity of their notes
- To make up for a missed class

## **Support for Planning Digital Teaching & Assessment**

We can help instructors plan / re-envision their teaching & evaluation approach:

- Planning a teaching mode <u>bimodal / remote / blended or hybrid</u>
- Select the appropriate platform for class activities (eg: group work, class discussion, etc.)
- o Choose / adjust teaching & learning activities (eg: project work, hands-on activities, etc.)
- Planning for online exams
- o Identifying exam needs and selecting the appropriate delivery platform (COLE / Moodle)
- o Identifying proctoring needs and selecting appropriate proctoring method (auto proctored / Zoom)
- Exam setup and configuration on COLE
- o In Exam support for students

# **Digital Resource Production Support**

The CTL and eConcordia are partnering to help instructors produce quality digital resources for their courses, including instructional videos, podcasts, and other digital media. Support includes:

- Individual consultation with an Instructional Designer plus up to 10 hours of video technical support (filming, editing, etc).
- Creating or revising recorded lectures and instructional videos\*:
  - Record lectures at home with IT equipment
  - o Record lectures on-campus with IT equipment and editing support
  - Record lectures using a Lightboard (with IT filming & editing support)
  - Edit existing lecture recordings in YuJa
  - o Add title slides to recordings
  - Edit captioning
  - Ensure digital resources follow accessibility best practices
- Creating conceptual graphics and instructional videos to support teaching\*
- Guidance and support to make digital resources accessible to all students
