Job Specific Requirements

Critical Thinking

Applicants must have:

- A completed PhD in Philosophy or a related field;
- Teaching experience at the University-level; and,
- Research background in critical thinking, logic, theories of reasoning, philosophy of mind, of psychology and psychological biases, epistemology, or related subject areas.

Because this course is offered online, the instructor is expected to teach the course as it has been designed. Experience with eConcordia or other online course systems is an asset.

New applicants to the department should include:

- a cover letter describing their qualifications for the courses for which they are applying;
- a statement of teaching approach;
- a copy of their C.V.; and,
- two letters of recommendation.

Applications by existing members for courses that they have not previously taught more than three times should include:

- a cover letter describing their qualifications for each of the classes they are applying for; and,
- a statement of teaching approach

CUPFA members will be given priority for this assignment. If you have not received your full allotment of courses, are qualified and interested in this position, or if you know of possible candidates from other Departments, please let me know at grievance@cupfa.org by: 5:00 p.m., Tuesday, Nov 13.

Your application materials will be forwarded to the Department at the deadline.
